The Jean Augustine Centre for Young Women's Empowerment is Back!

The Jean Augustine Centre for Young Women's Empowerment (JAC) celebrated International Day of the Girl on Monday, October 11th, by reuniting our girls at the Centre for the first time since the beginning of the pandemic.

Since 1995, the United Nations' International Day of the Girl has been recognized globally, increasing awareness of issues faced by girls around the world. After a year of increased use of digital activities, learning and communications, this year, the UN's theme is **Digital Generation, Our Generation**. The theme aims to create a digital revolution in which girls are equal players in tech, as they are less likely than boys to use and own devices and gain access to tech-related skills and jobs.

After almost two years of virtual programming, our girls participated in STEM activities, including coding, social entrepreneurship, and academic programs.

In alignment with the UN's theme, the Jean Augustine Centre launched JAC's #LegacyLeaders in STEM, highlighting girls in Science, Technology, Engineering & Math, kickstarting our overall Jean Augustine Centre Legacy Campaign fundraiser. We are encouraging the government, corporations, and the community to support our girls and the great programming we are implementing to put them on the path to success!

Our Founder

Honourable Jean Augustine

Dr. Jean Augustine P.C., C.M., O.Ont., C.B.E. is the first African-Canadian woman elected to the House of Commons. She was elected in the riding of Etobicoke-Lakeshore in 1993 and sat in Parliament until 2006. During this time, she served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister, Minister of State, and Deputy Speaker.

In 2007, Dr. Jean Augustine was nominated by the Government of Ontario as Fairness Commissioner, a position created to advocate for Canadians with foreign credentials.

Among Dr. Augustine's many achievements and honours includes leading the motion that allowed for the placement of the Famous Five statue on Parliament Hill in Ottawa and making Black History month official in Canada.
