Message from the Executive Director, AGM 2022-23

As we wrap up the 2022–23 fiscal year at the Jean Augustine Centre for Young Women's Empowerment (JAC), I am thrilled to reflect on the remarkable accomplishments we have achieved.

We entered this year with a sense of uncertainty, still learning from our pandemic experience. We still faced many uncertainties, such as how our participants would adjust to in-person programs, how our staff and facilitators would adapt to in-person work once again, and how we could enhance our support for the community during these precarious times.



Despite these obstacles, I am proud to say that we not only transitioned back to our "new normal" successfully, but we did so with flying colors!

In the 2022–23 fiscal year, we had over 1,300 community connections and over 700 individuals accessing our programs and services. This is a testament to our team's commitment to providing quality programs and services that cater to the unique needs of girls and young women in our community.

At JAC, we are constantly striving to innovate and improve our programs to ensure that they meet the needs of our young people. Our after-school programs, camps, and workshops are designed to be REEL: responsive, educational, engaging, and uplifting. We want to ensure that every girl and young woman who participates in our programs feels supported and empowered to achieve their full potential.

One of our many REEL program highlights from the 2022–2023 year was our inaugural STEAM Conference for girls. This conference brought together 141 girls and young women from across the Greater Toronto Area for a two-day experience of science, technology, engineering, arts, and math. It was an incredible opportunity for these young women to learn, grow, and connect with like-minded individuals.

We were also able to continue our Food to Table and Hygiene Program supports, which provided over 364 women and girls with monthly grocery store gift cards and hygiene kits to meet their basic needs. Our team recognizes the importance of addressing basic needs to ensure that the young women in our community have the resources they need to thrive.

Moreover, our board, staff, community partners, and supporters continued to rally together to ensure the sustainability of JAC. We successfully diversified our revenue sources to ensure funding through various grants, corporate and individual donations, and in–kind support from our community partners. One of the many opportunities we had to demonstrate this was our Black History Month Celebration & Fundraiser. This event brought over 250 individuals together for a screening of Dr. Augustine's documentary, STEADFAST, and to raise money for the JAC centre. It was a great success, and we are grateful to everyone who contributed their time, effort, and resources to make it happen.

Overall, the 2022-23 fiscal year was a tremendous success for JAC. I would like to express my sincerest gratitude and appreciation once again to all those who contributed to our success. Black History Month Celebration & Fundraiser

Youth Council - Spring 2022



Jean Augustine Centre's Youth Council program offers young women ages 13–17 the opportunity to develop a community action plan to tackle a social issue that matters to them. Members meet weekly for 12 weeks to develop, discuss, and research their chosen social issue. The program aims to encourage young women to be community minded and exercise their creative and collaborative skills.

Last Spring, Youth Council members chose to focus on the issue of domestic violence.

Together, they coordinated to host an event titled 'Love Shouldn't Hurt,' highlighting the prevalence of domestic abuse and advocating of victims. They also created a zine featuring original artwork, letters, poems, and resources for victims of domestic violence.










