OUR MISSION IN ACTION

EMPOWERING YOUTH: WHO WE SERVE AND WHY IT MATTERS

At the Jean Augustine Centre, we are dedicated to empowering young women to become catalysts for change.

By fostering curiosity and encouraging exploration, we help girls ignite their intellectual curiosity and passion for learning.

Our STEM programs and financial literacy workshops equip them with essential skills for their academic and career journeys. When young women recognize their worth and build confidence, they are better prepared to advocate for themselves, pursue opportunities, and lead with conviction. Our vision is to see these young women grow into leaders who enhance the quality of life for all.











ADDRESSING KEY CHALLENGES FACED BY OUR YOUTH

Achieving gender equity in Canada remains a significant challenge, with projections suggesting it could take 164 years. Persistent issues such as the pay gap, underrepresentation in STEM, and imbalances in leadership roles impact girls and young women, often affecting their self-esteem and ambitions.

To tackle these challenges, we offer a diverse range of programs that support the social, emotional, physical, and academic well-being of our participants. Our STEM initiatives, along with practical skills classes in cooking, sewing, martial arts, and self-defence, build confidence and capability. Creative expression is nurtured through arts and drama programs, and entrepreneurship and social enterprise initiatives foster business acumen.

Academic success is supported through peer tutoring, while personal development is enhanced by programs like HERSpot and the TeenSpot drop-in. Our Youth Council provides a platform for civic engagement and leadership, encouraging young women to contribute meaningfully to their communities. Special workshops and annual events, including the Winter Mingle, Black History Month, and Year-End Celebration, expand horizons and connect us to the broader community.

A cornerstone of our approach is the Look Up! Lift Up! Peer Mentorship Program, which offers tailored support to Black, racialized, and marginalized communities. This program fosters resilience and leadership by connecting mentees with mentors who share similar backgrounds, empowering them to overcome systemic challenges, build confidence, and create opportunities for personal and professional growth.

Through this comprehensive approach, we aim to help young women overcome barriers, reach their full potential, and build a more equitable future.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

PROGRAM REACH, IMPACT, AND FEEDBACK: A SNAPSHOT OF OUR SUCCESS

We are proud to highlight the significant impact of our programs on young women.

Over the past fiscal year, we positively engaged 400 girls and young women, ages 7-17, through our after-school programs, workshops, and camps.

Our core mission is to build confidence and empowerment in girls and young women. To achieve this, we offer diverse opportunities that encourage them to step out of their comfort zones and explore new activities. Our programs are designed around four key pillars: Academics & STEM, Financial Literacy, Civic Engagement, and Empowerment.

Feedback from our spring 2023 survey indicates that 66% of teen participants reported increased self-confidence and other personal benefits from their involvement in our programs.

This snapshot reflects the meaningful progress of our youth and our unwavering commitment to their growth and empowerment.

STORIES FROM THE FIELD: HOW OUR PROGRAMS ARE CHANGING LIVES

Our programs are more than just activities - they are transformative experiences that change lives. Through our dedicated efforts, we see firsthand how our initiatives empower young women, build their confidence, and pave the way for their future successes.

BUILDING SKILLS AND CONFIDENCE IN STEM AND FINANCIAL LITERACY

Our *Let's Experiment* science program for girls 7-12 proved to be especially popular this year, with a third of participants returning for one or more sessions within the program year. "My favourite part of Let's Experiment is planning out, because I like, either digital or on paper, I like using technology and on paper, I like to draw," shared a 10-year-old participant. Hands-on learning activities allow youth to explore science, technology, engineering, and math in ways that resonate with their individual interests, laying the foundation for future success in these fields.





Last summer, we partnered with *Jean Augustine Secondary School* in Brampton to offer a satellite STEM Summer Camp for girls and young women. This two-week summer program was positively received by parents and participants alike (89% of participants said the program met or exceeded expectations), who noted a lack of affordable and girl-centered programs in the area.

Earlier this year, some of our youth March Break participants took part in a pilot of *Money Matters*, a financial resiliency program designed for girls and young women ages 7-17. Over the course of 5 sessions, participants learned about basic financial concepts like budgeting in an engaging and accessible way. In 2024/2025, we will be piloting Money Matters to a wider audience by making it a regular part of our after-school program roster.

EMPOWERING GIRLS AND YOUNG WOMEN THROUGH LIFE SKILLS

Our cooking classes provided a valuable platform for learning life skills such as meal planning, time management, and teamwork. Participants not only gained confidence in the kitchen but also developed essential abilities that can be applied in their daily lives. The introduction of new kitchen equipment and a Farm to Table field trip further enriched their experience.

The *Heart.Mind.Movement*. workshop series, held in the fall of 2023, focused on promoting physical and emotional wellness through culturally diverse dance and mindfulness activities. This program successfully encouraged self-expression and an appreciation for cultural diversity, with 93% of participants expressing interest in future workshops.

In spring of 2024, *Craft for a Cause* workshops empowered young creators to understand the business side of crafting, including pricing and selling their creations. This experience highlighted how businesses can support community initiatives.

Additionally, our new *TeenSpot* project engaged teens in designing their own space, fostering a sense of ownership and pride.

These programs underscore our commitment to empowering girls and young women by building their confidence, life skills, and active participation in shaping their environments.

EMPOWERING YOUTH THROUGH THE ARTS AND SELF-EXPRESSION

Our arts programs, including *Craftastic*, provide youth with unique opportunities to explore their creativity and engage in hands-on projects. "I like making soaps at Craftastic. And I also like field trips, I also like going to places and doing fun activities," shared a 10-year-old participant. Through projects like soap-making, youth not only express themselves creatively but also gain valuable skills and experiences that enhance their personal growth and enjoyment.

INSPIRING YOUTH THROUGH PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND MENTORSHIP

Our *Look Up! Lift Up! Peer Mentorship Program* has been a lifeline for many of our youth. "It was so helpful to get ideas from someone who has already gone through my path and help me understand how to make good choices going forward," said one mentee. One of our mentors shared, "I think it's a great program and an inviting way for young girls to have someone to lean on and guide them through life experiences. I would definitely recommend this program," said another.

LEADING CHANGE AND DRIVING IMPACT THROUGH YOUTH COUNCIL INITIATIVES

This year, our teen participants have excelled in leadership and civic engagement through a series of impactful initiatives. They began with the *Open Doors* event in Spring 2023, addressing systemic barriers to education and employment. Their leadership continued with a vibrant International Day of the Girl event, which featured an engaging scavenger hunt and 'Changemaker booths' celebrating trailblazing women.

Their commitment to civic action was further demonstrated in winter 2024 with a *Black History Month* panel discussion. By engaging with a thought-provoking film and participating in facilitated dialogue, they showcased their developing leadership skills.

Their proactive approach also extended to community care, where they identified food insecurity as a critical issue and successfully pitched the *SustainHER Nutrition Initiative*. This initiative, generously supported by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, exemplifies their dedication to creating meaningful change and highlights their growth as influential leaders.

FEATURED INITIATIVES: INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

At the Jean Augustine Centre, our innovative programs are driving meaningful change:

LOOK UP! LIFT UP! (LULU!) PEER MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Our new peer mentorship program was launched in August 2023, with a focus on enhancing the mental health and well-being of girls and young women from marginalized communities. This pilot program paired girls ages 7 to 17 with mentors ages 18 to 30 for up to a year, offering workshops for mentors and allowing for in-person or virtual meetings. With over 62% of mentees finding their mentors approachable and 100% wanting to continue, the program demonstrated significant success.

This year, we refined our mentorship programs with a research-based approach, partnering with the George Hull Centre for Children and Families to connect Black, racialized, and marginalized girls with mentors who share their backgrounds. This initiative aims to build confidence, address systemic challenges, and empower young women. For more details on becoming a mentor (ages 18-30) or a mentee (ages 7-17), *visit our website*.

TEENSPOT

Our teen participants voiced a desire for a space that recognizes their needs as young women and fosters their sense of independence, individuality, and unique capabilities. In 2023/2024, we worked to create a space just for them with the support of Interior Designers of Canada, in-kind donations from Aurora Design Inc. and their industry partners, and generous funding from a grant.

We revitalized a 1,178 sq. ft. room to create an exclusive teen space. In this third space, outside of home and school, young women in our community can build friendships, receive programs and find a supportive community that will contribute to their improved mental health, academic performance, and social development.



SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

In the spring of 2024, the Centre launched a new social enterprise to create additional revenue streams, support financial growth, and provide valuable skills-building opportunities for our youth. We refreshed our branded merchandise with new totes, t-shirts, and hoodies that celebrate our founder's legacy and reflect our core values. Additionally, we invested in our young women's talents by launching *NourishHER*, a line of skincare and beauty products handcrafted by our girls and young women. Proceeds from NourishHER directly support our programming, benefiting the participants through their entrepreneurial skills and contributions.

REAL STORIES OF IMPACT

YOUTH VOICES: PERSONAL JOURNEYS OF EMPOWERMENT

Our programs ignite transformation in the lives of young women. By participating in STEM workshops, arts programs, and leadership initiatives, our youth discover their passions and build their futures.

Our focus on entrepreneurship and civic engagement has also had a profound impact. Harini, 17, volunteered as a peer tutor and participated in our Youth Council, where young women gain volunteer hours and leadership skills while creating community action plans to address local challenges. "My experience with the Youth Council was filled with friendships and empowerment," Harini says. "Sharing our goals and accomplishments with each other during icebreakers, and working together on big projects like organizing workshops about domestic abuse, making petitions to combat homelessness, and planning a trip to a food bank, allowed me to be a part of a community and provided me with a sense of purpose and belonging in the midst of the pandemic and the social struggles of high school."

Her story reflects the profound impact of our tailored programs, empowering young women to envision and achieve their potential.

FAMILY PERSPECTIVES: HOW OUR WORK IMPACTS HOMES AND COMMUNITIES

Our programs extend their influence beyond the individual, resonating deeply within families and communities. Families of participants often share how our initiatives have strengthened their homes and broader social circles. One parent recently expressed their gratitude, saying, "We just wanted to send a HUGE thank you for the lovely End of the Year Party yesterday! It was wonderful to see all the girls having so much fun and receiving their certificates! Your centre has been such an important part of our family [for the last six years]. We are so grateful for the community you've brought to Ava and even to me. I just wanted to take a moment to express how much we appreciate all of you and the kindness, generosity, and thoughtfulness you show to the girls!"

Communities benefit from the increased confidence and leadership skills of our youth, who contribute actively and meaningfully, enhancing collective well-being and creating a ripple effect of positive change.

SPOTLIGHT ON YOUTH LEADERS: PARTICIPANTS WHO ARE CREATING CHANGE

Our youth leaders are making significant strides in creating change both locally and beyond. Shaaliny, 17, reflects on her journey from being a long-time participant to stepping into a Counsellor-in-Training role:

"Having spent 10 years here as a participant, stepping into the staff role felt like becoming a living history book of JAC. I've witnessed the camp's evolution firsthand and experienced its impact from a unique perspective. It's been incredible to see how the camp has grown and to contribute to its ongoing story. I'll never forget the moments we shared and the lessons I've learned from each of you. This experience has shaped me in ways I didn't expect, and I'm so thankful to have been part of such a supportive team. I'm deeply grateful for everything, and the gift card was a wonderful surprise."

Shaaliny's journey from participant to Counsellor-in-Training exemplifies the transformative impact of our programs. Her growth and dedication reflect the core values of empowerment and community involvement that we strive to instill in all our youth.





SPOTLIGHT ON COLLABORATION, RESEARCH & ADVOCACY

OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS: AMPLIFYING OUR REACH

This year, we are proud to highlight several impactful partnerships that have enriched our arts, culture, and food programs.

Ishi Robinson's introduction of her book "Sweetness in the Skin" to our young adult library collection, Ayodele (Ayo) Gilpin's "Hair as Therapy: Taming Black Madness" photography workshop and donated hair products, and Benny Bing's fabulous art class and donated prints for our TeenSpot have all provided transformative experiences for our youth.

Chef Selwyn Richards, executive chef and founder of The Art of Catering, generously catered our 10th Anniversary Community Picnic, treating our guests to some of the best Caribbean cuisine in the city, and regularly donates hot meals to our youth whenever he's "cheffing it up" at the Centre.

We also renewed our collaboration with *Great Lakes Brewery*, which brewed up the special Empowered brew for our anniversary. This limited-edition beer was more than a celebration; it was a vital fundraiser, with proceeds directly supporting the Jean Augustine Centre and our mission to uplift girls and young women.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all our partners and collaborators, named and unnamed, whose generous support enables us to continue our work and make a lasting impact in our community. Your contributions are invaluable to our mission and success.







RESEARCH AND ADVOCACY: DRIVING INFORMED CHANGE

This year, our community engagement efforts have reached new heights through several impactful partnerships and initiatives focused on research and advocacy.

EMPOWERED REPORT

In addition, the *Empowered Report*, an annual spring publication by the Jean Augustine Centre in collaboration with the *University of Toronto's Community Action Program*, explored the impact of mentorship programs on girls and young women in Canada. This year's report, which incorporated insights from the LULU! initiative, emphasized the importance of early intervention, long-term mentor commitments, and cultural competence. In response to these findings and with support from the *George Hull Centre for Children and Families*, we are enhancing the Look Up! Lift Up! Program for the 2024 cohort.

COMMUNITY ASSET MAP

Also in the spring, our collaboration with the *Centre for Community Partnerships* (CCP) at the *University of Toronto* on a PhD seminar project resulted in a comprehensive Community Asset Map. This valuable resource has significantly influenced and guided various projects and programs.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH ROUNDTABLE

In March, during Black Mental Health Week, the Jean Augustine Centre hosted a pivotal Youth Mental Health Roundtable. Chaired by *Honourable Ya'ara Saks* and facilitated by *Mitzie Hunter*, with support from *Richard Miller* of Keep6ix Organization, this event provided a platform for youth to voice their mental health challenges and advocate for enhanced services. It underscored our commitment to inclusive participation and civic engagement, aligning with our core values and *UNICEF Canada*'s principles of fostering social equity and healthy communities.

These initiatives reflect our dedication to advancing community engagement and addressing the needs of those we serve, reinforcing our commitment to creating positive change.

EMBRACING GROWTH AND ACHIEVING TRANSFORMATION

ADAPTING TO EVOLVING NEEDS AND STRENGTHENING OUR FOUNDATION

In response to sector-wide challenges—such as reduced donations, heightened funder expectations, and shifting youth needs post-COVID—as well as the departure of our long-serving Executive Director, we have made key adjustments to reinforce our foundation and enhance our community impact. Our updated strategies focus on exploring new fundraising, diversifying revenue, and refining programs to meet evolving needs.

TRANSFORMATIVE WINS: CELEBRATING OUR PROGRESS

Despite ongoing challenges, our achievements in 2023-24 underscore our commitment to resilience and innovation. We have made significant strides in the following key areas:

- **Confirmed Strategic Priorities:** Solidified our strategic priorities for 2024-26 to ensure alignment with our mission and continued focus on key areas of impact.
- **Strengthened Strategic Capabilities:** Engaged specialists to assist us with developing new strategies, including advocacy, volunteer engagement, and communications and outreach strategies, positioning us for future success.
- **Strengthened Financial Management:** Enhanced our financial position through diversified funding and zero-based budgeting, while improving internal controls and adopting digital banking and a new grant management tracker for greater transparency and stability.
- Launched a Social Enterprise: Introduced a new revenue stream through branded merchandise and a youth-made bath and beauty line, diversifying our funding and creating additional opportunities for skills development, growth and impact.

- **Prioritized Workplace Culture:** Enhanced compensation, benefits, and training, while reducing precarious employment, creating promotional opportunities, and supporting employee engagement, wellness and recognition events.
- Increased Equity & Diversity: Enhanced our commitment to diversity and equity by amending our procurement, interviewing and scoring methods, auditing staff and facilitator rates for equity, and introducing transparent pay practices.
- **Upgraded Facilities & Infrastructure:** Expanded and upgraded our physical space to increase capacity, improve safety, and support enhanced program delivery.
- **Enhanced Technology:** Implemented new software to improve our ability to identify funding opportunities and manage donor relationships, and conducted a third-party tech and systems audit to ensure optimal performance and integration.
- Enhanced Tools & Knowledge Management: Designed a new website, internal tools, trackers, and a knowledge management plan to improve onboarding, enhance operational efficiency, and preserve valuable insights.

While significant progress has been made, our focus remains on continuing to adapt and improve, staying true to our mission, and providing impactful support to our community.

Additionally, we are developing a new financial literacy curriculum tailored specifically to the needs of our younger participants. This curriculum aims to equip them with essential money management skills and empower them to make informed financial decisions from an early age.

We are also excited to expand our social enterprise, which has already captured significant interest with our sought-after new products, including lip oils, tub teas, and the pop art-inspired Jean Augustine Centre t-shirts featuring our legendary founder. These t-shirts will be proudly worn by all of our summer staff and Counsellors-in-Training for the 2024/2025 camp season.


This expansion will introduce new product lines and business opportunities, further enhancing our participants' entrepreneurial skills and deepening their connection with our mission.






